Operation School Bell® has a new home!

For almost 40 years, the Indianapolis Public Schools' administration has provided Assistance League with free space for our Operation School Bell program. We appreciate their generosity and will continue to serve their students. Due to IPS restructuring and the sale of various buildings, we began a search in 2021 to find a home for our program. With the help of our member volunteer committee and real estate advisor Jack Hogan, we secured a site near our office at 86th and Ditch. We are so proud of our Northbrook Distribution Center. Many members and nonmembers were instrumental in organizing and decorating the space to make it a functional and pleasant environment. On September 19th, we celebrated the **Grand Opening** of Northbrook Distribution Center with friends, family, donors and those who support our mission. It was a special accomplishment for our organization.



Operation School Bell offers three distinct divisions that provide new clothing, outerwear and athletic shoes to underserved children. Besides meeting fundamental needs, these items raise students' self-esteem enabling them to be more successful in the classroom. School personnel from Indianapolis Public Schools and the Metropolitan School Districts of Lawrence, Pike, Warren, Washington and Wayne Townships identify and refer the K - 5 students served by this division.

The Operation School Bell program encountered some difficulties with the world-wide supply chain issue. Our ability to order the items we needed was challenging and shipping costs were exorbitant. Our team met these struggles head on and were able to meet the needs of many economically challenged students in Indianapolis.

Operation School Bell®...Empowering Children to Succeed

Apparel

We utilize a Pack & Deliver method to serve area students. Families complete a sizing form which they return to our leadership team via school personnel. Each child receives a duffel bag, winter coat, hat, gloves, six pairs of socks and underwear, two polo shirts, two navy or khaki pants or skirts and a toothbrush. The apparel provided is often the first new clothing the students have owned.

For the 2022-23 school year, the Apparel division provided clothing for 1,517 IPS students and 1,059 Township students. In January of 2023 we hope to distribute additional duffel bags to deserving children.



Shoes

Our Shoes division provides new athletic shoes to students through a tracing process. Tracing packets are sent to schools. School personnel trace both feet of each child participating. Assistance League has a partnership with a shoe retailer whose staff fit shoes based on the tracings, bag the shoes and label each with student's name, school, and teacher. School districts arrange delivery of the shoes to their schools. For the 2022-23 school year, 835 IPS students and 1,165 Township students are enjoying happy feet in new shoes.

Beyond the Bell

The goal of Beyond the Bell is to supply new school clothing to students with emergency needs. These students may be homeless, displaced, new to their schools, or unable to obtain school clothes for any reason. Beyond the Bell provides an inventory of uniform pants and shirts, underwear and socks. In 2022-23, the ninth year of the Beyond the Bell division, forty-eight IPS elementary schools and nine Pike Township schools received 144 Beyond the Bell bags containing a variety of sizes of clothing.

Assault Survivor Kits®...Restoring Hope and Dignity

The goal of the Assault Survivor Kits® program is to assemble and distribute kits of new sweatshirts, sweatpants, socks and undergarments for victims of assault, rape or domestic violence to area hospitals, shelter and treatment centers.

Due to supply chain issues and a large increase in shipping costs, it was problematic receiving the items needed to complete our kits. In spite of these complications, our committee worked hard and were able to deliver 761 kits and 983 additional undergarments to 13 agencies.

ALI Bears...Providing Comfort through Hugs

Teddy bears provided by the ALI Bears program bring comfort to children in hospitals, hospice patients and children and adults grieving a loss. In 2021-22 Assistance League members delivered 905 bears to 13 local agencies including hospitals, hospices and family service centers. Assistance League member volunteers dress the bears in an Assistance League t-shirt and attach a note that says, "Hug your bear today."



ALI Friends...Offering Friendship and Cheer

This was not a typical year for our ALI Friends program. Both Joy's House and North Capitol Nursing Rehabilitation Center were closed to visitors on many occasions. We were fortunate to serve dessert and play bingo for six months of the year at North Capitol. Christmas bags with body lotion, shampoo, toothpaste, toothbrushes, lip balm, deodorant and sugar-free candy were distributed, along with new calendars, to 60 guests. For clients at Joy's House, we played virtual bingo and delivered treats.

2022 Action!Week

Donor and community support exceeded our expectations for *Action!Week 2022*. Focusing on literacy, two community schools were selected as the recipient of our efforts. The schools were selected on the basis of their student demographics, standardized test scores and an ongoing housing crisis affecting many families at the school.

On February 24, 2022, Assistance League members were invited into first and second second grade classrooms to read books aloud. After hearing the stories, students were permitted to select one book to take home and keep. Seeing the children's faces light up as they selected their very own books was very rewarding and reinforced the importance of our mission.

Thanks to the generosity of our donors, we were able to expand the original parameters of *Action!Week* to include a second school.



Another aspect of *Action!Week* involved arranging a book fair at a local bookstore. The store held an in-store online book fair where books could be purchased to be donated to classrooms.

As President of Assistance League® of Indianapolis, it is my pleasure to share with you our 2021-22 Annual Report. We are still in a time of change but are beginning to settle into a new normal. We have made post-Covid transitions to many activities, especially our Operation School Bell® program. While we have changed our processes, we have not changed our mission: to transform lives of children and adults through our community programs.

Our biggest change for the year - and one of the biggest challenges we have faced as a nonprofit - has been the opening of our Northbrook Distribution Center, the new home to Operation School Bell. The program has changed to a Pack and Deliver process - another example of our new normal! We miss having one-on-one contact with the children we serve, but we will never waver from our mission to provide school clothing and shoes to economically challenged students.

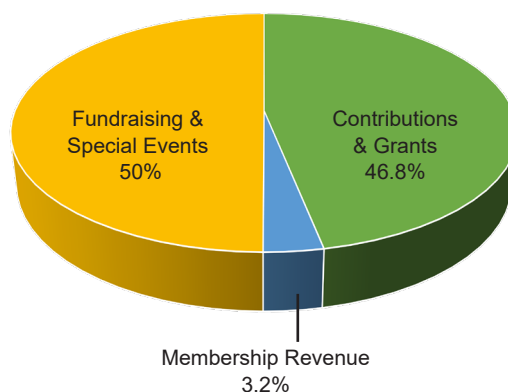

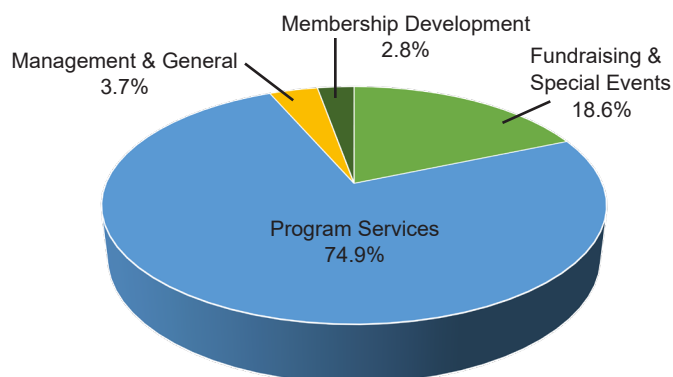

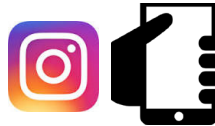
